Christopher Wren (1632-1723) designed and built 51 churches following the Great Fire of 1666 to replace churches that had been destroyed. His work is defined by diverse, innovative tower designs and elegant, light filled interiors, with St. Pauls Cathedral serving as his masterpiece. Many of the churches are still standing and we will visit a few. Christopher Wren was a deeply religious and an Anglican rooted in a staunchly royalist and church-affiliated family. His father was the Dean of Windsor.
